- (a) Will he inform this House
  - (i) of the number of plastic manufacturing factories in Sri Lanka;
  - (ii) separately, of the annual production volumes of plastic and polythene in Sri Lanka;
  - (iii) of the measures that have been taken to minimize the use of plastic and polythene; and
  - (iv) whether attention has been paid regarding the quality of plastic food packaging, intended for young children?
