1. Mission

2. Key Functions

- (i) Exercising the legislative power of the people.
- (ii) Exercising full control over public finance.
- (iii) Exercising oversight over the executive.

3. Organizational Structure

The secretarial and staff services required for performance of the duties of Parliament headed by the Hon. Speaker are provided by the office of the Secretary-General of Parliament.

3.1 Serjeant-at-Arms Department:

To facilitate effective functioning of the Parliament by providing highest possible quality services in a timely and efficient manner to the Hon. Members of Parliament, including;

- * Ceremonial duties, preservation of order in the Parliament Chamber, custody of mace and security, admission of visitors to the Parliament building and supervision of galleries,
- * Preservation of the Parliament building and allocation of accommodation within the Parliamentary Complex,
- * Preparation of the Seniority Lists of Hon. Members of Parliament and allotment of Seats in the Chamber of the Parliament, administration and supervision of Seating Arrangements.

3.2 Administration Department:

- * Attends to matters relating to Recruitment, Orientation, Training, Skill Development, Employee Education and Discipline.
- * The administrative support for MPP and the Staff transport is managed by this Department. The following sections contribute to perform those functions:-

3.3 Hansard Department:

Ensures impartial accurate and timely reporting of Parliamentary Proceedings, Parliamentary Committees, Conferences and CPA and IPU conferences and indexing and monitoring of audio recordings.

3.4 Co-ordinating Engineer's Department:

- * Coordinating Engineer's Department ensures that Parliament estate is effectively and efficiently maintained as a significant public building of the nation.

- * Payments to members, pensioners and staff and for suppliers and services.



5.2.2 Committees for Special Purposes:

(i). Committee of Selection:

The Committee of Selection is appointed under Standing Order No: 121. The Committee of Selection of the seventh Parliament consists of 18 members including Hon.Speaker, Deputy Speaker and DCC and Leaders of the Parties. 04 meetings were held during the year 2014.

(ii). Committee on Privileges:

The Committee on Privileges is appointed under Standing Order No. 127. The Committee in the 7th Parliament consists of 15 members.

08 Complaints regarding the breach of privileges were received from Hon. Members by the Committee within the year 2014 and 06 complaints have been investigated.

(iii). Committee on High Posts:

The Committee on High Posts is established under the Standing Order No. 128 (a). The Committee consists of 17 members at present. The role of this committee is to examine and to recommend the suitability of persons appointed or nominated to hold high posts as Heads of Sri Lankan missions in foreign countries, Secretaries to the Ministries and Chairmen of Corporations and Boards.

The Committee on High Posts held 08 meetings during the year 2014, where 14 ambassadors/ High Commissioners, 17 Secretaries to the Ministries and 32 Chairmen were summoned before the Committee for examining their suitability and recommendations were made.

(iv). Committee on Standing Orders:

This committee which is appointed under Standing Order 123, functions under the Chairmanship of the Hon. Speaker. The Committee on Standing Orders has not held meetings during the year 2014.

(v). Committee on Public Accounts:

The Committee on Public Accounts examined 44 institutions in the year 2014 and The Committee without being confined itself to the Audit paras referred to the Parliament by the Auditor-General, examined the current issues and controversial matters frequently discussed in the society in the year 2014.

The Caucus has conducted 13 meetings within year 2014. A special summit was organized by the Caucus on 07 March 2014 to commemorate the International Women's Day with the participation of all Members of Parliament, foreign dignitaries and government officers.

5.3 Bills Office:

During the year 2014 this office attended to the activities of preparation of bills appropriately in Sinhala, Tamil & English languages, comparison and attending to other activities related to it and consequential activities, in the process of the passing of a bill which was presented to the Parliament in accordance with the provisions in the Constitution and Standing Orders of Parliament.

- * During year 2014, 26 gazetted government bills were received by this Office and action was taken to publish gazettes for 17 Private Members' Bills. The number of bills certified by the Hon. Speaker after passage in Parliament was 47 (this consists of 26 government Bills and 21 Private Members' Bills)

- * Two meetings of the Legislative Standing Committee were held during year 2014 and private members bills were considered by those committees.

In addition to the above, the following activities, too, were performed by the Bills Office during year 2014.

- a) Providing necessary facilities for the Public and Members of Parliament to obtain the information of legislative services uploaded in the Intranet of Parliament through the Website of Parliament in all three languages.
- b) Updating the legislative services information system in relation to Bills.
- c) Compilation of all the acts that were passed during year 2013 and making arrangements to bind them as a book.
- d) Compilation of Supreme Court determinations related to the Bills of year 2013 and making arrangements to print them as a book.
- e) Dissemination of information with relevance to Bills and the process of passing them upon requests made by the Members of Parliament, Ministries, Provincial Councils and various Institutions was also carried out by the Bills Office during year 2014.

5.4 Table Office :

*** 91 Parliamentary meetings were held during the year 2014. The following activities, too, were performed in relation to the Parliamentary meetings:-**

- i. Three order books, with 22 Addendums connected thereto, regarding Parliamentary Sittings, including the motions and questions for oral answers that are expected to be submitted in future, order papers and minuetts regarding 91 parliamentary sittings were prepared and printed in Sinhala, Tamil and English languages.
- ii. Measures were taken to distribute the aforesaid printed Order Books, Addendums and Order Papers to the Ministers, Deputy Ministers and all the Members of parliament, Secretaries to ministries and other Heads of Departments concerned via express mail, and to place them on their tables in the House.
- iii. Measures were taken to present to the Parliament 425 performance reports and Annual reports of Ministries, Departments, Corporations and Statutory Boards which were forwarded by each Ministry, motions including orders and regulations that were imposed under various acts which were published in Gazette.
- iv. Measures were taken to include in Order book 1336 Questions for Oral Answers, which were submitted by Members of Parliament, after editing them in keeping with standing orders and translating them into Sinhala Tamil and English languages.

Steps were taken to answer altogether 720 Questions for Oral Answers including 105 Questions for which time was taken in 2013.
- v. Measures were taken to take on 60 private members' motions and 3 no date motions, to edit them and to translate them in to Sinhala Tamil and English languages and include the same in Order book.
- vi. Measures were taken to convene 27 sittings of the Committee on Parliamentary Business, to issue minutes concerned in all the three languages and to carry out follow activities with regard to the said decisions.
- vii. Measures were taken to set up the programme of the sitting-day proceedings including 12 announcements received from His Excellency the President, 115 announcements by the speaker, and 49 Bills including 27 Bills of the Government, Supreme Court rulings on the Bills and presentation of documents of the Ministers and so forth.
- viii. Measures were taken to present 08 votes of condolence to Parliament and to send the relevant Hansard reports to the late Members' spouses or their next of kin.

5.5 Contribution from other sections of the Institution in brief :

- iv. Members' Services Office ensured that the Members of Parliament are provided with the facilities and the services that are approved to facilitate the affairs of their office as parliamentarians, by the relevant sections of the Parliament and other external sections, properly, in time.
- v. Activities in Audit and Management Committee, Inquiries, Pre- Auditing, Checking no claims in respect of pension files and certification were attended by the Internal Audit Office of the Parliament, during the period under review
- vi. In addition, actions were taken to implement the decisions of the Audit and Management Committee.

Attended to all the activities and services related to the matters of Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, Inter Parliamentary Association and Association of SAARC Parliamentarians.

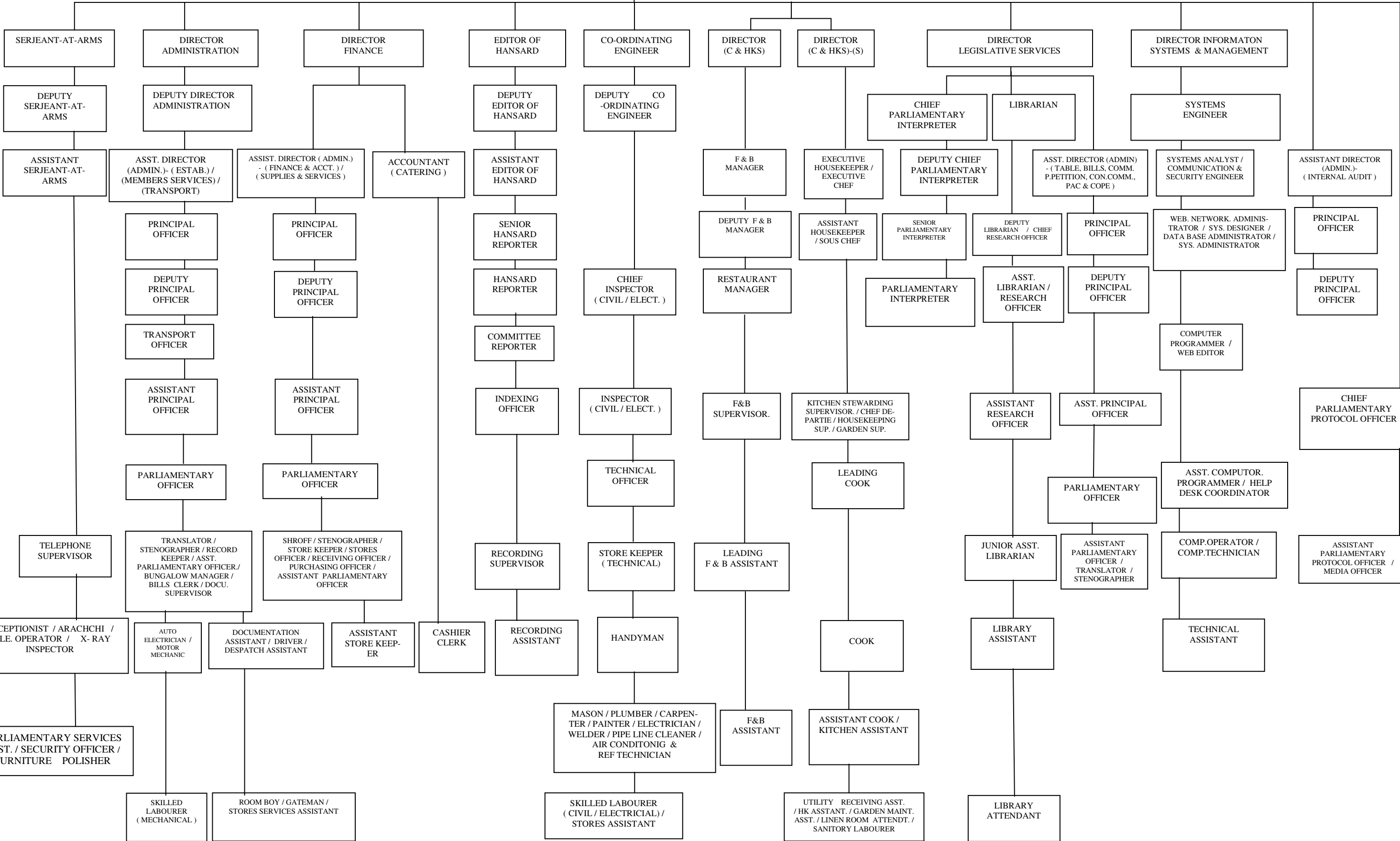
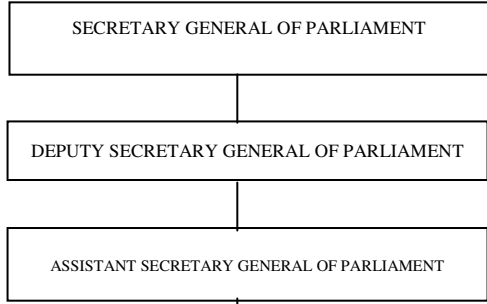
