5.2.2 Committees for Special Purposes:

(i). Committee of Selection:

The Committee of Selection is appointed under Standing Order No: 121. The Committee in the seventh Parliament consists of 18 members including Hon.Speaker, Deputy Speaker and DCC and Leaders of the Parties.08 meetings were held during the year 2013.

(ii). Committee on Privileges:

The Committee on Privileges is appointed under Standing Order No. 127. The Committee in the 7th Parliament consists of 15 members.

15 Complaints regarding the breach of privileges were received from Hon. Members by the Committee within the year 2013 and are being investigated

(iii). Committee on High Posts:

The Committee on High Posts is established under the Standing Order No. 128 (a). The Committee consists of 19 members at present. The role of this committee is to examine the suitability of persons appointed or nominated to hold high posts as Heads of Sri Lankan missions in foreign countries, Secretaries to the Ministries and Chairman of Corporations Boards and to make recommendations.

The Committee on High Posts held 07 meetings during the year 2013, where 08 ambassadors/ High Commissioners, 13 Secretaries to the Ministries and 20 Chairman were summoned before the Committee for examining their suitability and recommendations were made.

(iv). Committee on Standing Orders:

This committee appointed under Standing Order 123, functioned under the Chairmanship of the Hon. Speaker. The Committee on Standing Orders has not held meetings during the year 2013.

(v). Committee on Public Accounts:

The Committee on Public Accounts examined 43 Ministries & Departments based on Audit Paras, Excesses, Non-compliances and other relevant matters in the year 2013.

In addition, the Committee successfully completed its assignment of work and presented its **First Report** in respect of the 69 Ministries & Departments examined by the Committee, to the Parliament on 25th of July, 2013.

The Committee without being confined itself to the Audit paras referred to the Parliament by the Auditor-General, examined the current issues and controversial matters frequently discussed in the society.

In addition, the Committee successfully completed its assignment of work and presented its Second Report in respect of the 244 Public Enterprises examined by the Main Committee and three Sub - Committees, to the Parliament on 23rd of July, 2013.

(vii) Committee on Public Petitions:

The first Committee meeting for the year 2013 was held on 06.02.2013 and during the year two special Committee meetings and 32 usual Committee meetings were held in which 172 petition files were completed providing relief to 49 Petitioners.

The Committee, paying attention to the fact that relief measures are not enacted when referred to the Public Services Commission due to the clashes that arise from its procedural rules when implementing the recommendation/decisions the Committee makes after hearing the petitions, held the two aforesaid special Committee meetings with the participation of the Secretary of Public Service Commission in order to settle such problems and the final decision made at the end of those special meetings was to call the Attorney General and seek advice on how the Public Petitions Committee and the Public Services Commission should carry out their duties avoiding any conflict.

5.2.3 Select Committees:

(i) Select Committee of Parliament to Recommend and Report on Political and Constitutional Measures to Empower the People of Sri Lanka to live as one Nation.

The Select Committee was established with the chairmanship of Hon. Nimal Siripala de Silva Leader of the House of the Parliament. 11 Committee meetings were held during the year 2013.

The Committee received 109 public representations on the terms of this Committee and 37 such were summoned before the Committee for oral evidence.

The Committee also had requested the 64 registered political parties to submit their representations with regard to the terms of the Committee.

(ii) Select Committee to Discuss the Heads of Expenditure of Selected Ministries from the Budget Estimates for the year 2014.

Considering the limited time period allocated for Committee stage programme of the Budget, a select Committee is appointed to discuss the Heads of expenditure of Ministries decided by the Parliamentary Business Committee. A Select Committee was appointed with the Chairmanship of Hon. Nimal Siripala de Silva the Leader of the House of the Parliament with 21 members to discuss the heads of Expenditure of the following 23 Ministries and the 10 Secretariat for special Purposes.

The Committee held its meetings from 02nd December 2013 to 9th December 2013 in eight days with the presence of Hon. Ministers, Deputy Ministers, Hon. Members and the officials of the relevant Ministries during the period from the Commencement of the Second reading of the Appropriate Bill (2014) and submitted a comprehensive report to the Parliament. The report consisted of all the subject matters discussed in the Committee, valuable suggestions forwarded by Hon. Members of Parliament and recommendations made thereof amendments accepted by the Committee to be considered during the Committee stage Programme.

Ad-hoc Committee

Women Parliamentarians' Caucus

Women Parliamentarian's Caucus, consists of all women Parliamentarians, has been established to discuss and work together for the empowerment of girls and women in Sri Lanka and for elimination of all sorts of violence & harassments against them.

Women Caucus has commenced various Awareness programmes, workshops, training and conferences during the year 2013.

5.3 Bills Office :

During the year 2013 this office attended to the activities of preparation of bills appropriately in Sinhala, Tamil & English languages, Comparison and attending to other activities related to it and consequential activities, in the process of the passing of a bill which was presented to the Parliament in accordance with the provisions in the Constitution and Standing Orders of the Parliament.

* During the year 2013, 87 gazetted bills were presented to the Parliament and out of the aforesaid number, 36 bills (34 Nos. of Government Bills and 02 Nos. of Private Members' Bills) were made into Law.

(Please see <u>Annexure 02</u> for the List of Acts of 2013.)

* Similarly the Bills Office carried out the tasks of making all arrangements to conduct the meetings of Legislative Standing Committees for the consideration of the Bills, Draft statutes referred to the Standing Committee and preparing the minutes and the reports of the Committees in all three languages. Accordingly 05 Legislative Standing Committee Meetings were conducted during the period and the Committees have considered Private Members' Bills.

In addition, the following activities were also performed by the Bills Office during the year 2013.

- a) Providing necessary facilities to the Public and Members of Parliament to obtain the information of legislative services uploaded in the Intranet of Parliament through the Website of Parliament in all three languages.
- b) Compilation of the Supreme Court Determinations related to the Bills of the years 2010, 2011, 2012 and printing them as a book.
- c) Updating the Legislative information system with relevance to Bills.
- d) Dissemination of information with relevance to Bills and the process of passing them, upon requests made by the Members of Parliament, Ministries, Provincial Councils and various Institutions.

5.4 Table Office :

* 89 Parliamentary meeting were held during the year 2013. The following activities were also performed with regard to the Parliamentary meetings :-

- i. Three order books, with 26 Addendums connected thereto, regarding Parliamentary Sittings, including the motions and oral questions that are expected to be submitted in future, order papers and minuets regarding 89 parliamentary sittings, were prepared in Sinhala, Tamil and English languages and were printed
- ii. Measures were taken to distribute, aforesaid printed Order books, Addendums and Order Papers, to the Ministers, Deputy Ministers including all the Members of parliament, Secretaries to the ministries and other Heads of Departments concerned, via express mail, and to place them on their tables.
- iii. Measures were taken to present, 392 performance reports and Annual reports of Ministries, Departments, corporations and statutory Boards which were forwarded by each Ministry, 10 reports on supplementary allocations that were made by Budgetary Support Services and contingent liability project of National Budget Department under Appropriation Bill, 87 motions including orders and regulations

that were imposed under various acts which were published in Gazette, to the Parliament.

- iv. Measures were taken to include, 1398 Questions for oral Answers which were submitted by Members of Parliament, in Order book, editing them in keeping with standing orders and translating them in to Sinhala Tamil and English languages. Steps were taken to Answer 719 Questions for oral Answers including 379 oral questions for which time was taken in 2012.
- v. Measures were taken to take on 24 private members' motions and 3 no date motions, to edit them and to translate them in to Sinhala Tamil and English languages and include same in Order book.
- vi. Measures were taken to convene 30 sittings of Parliamentary Business committee, to issue minutes concerned in three languages and follow up the background of said decisions.
- Vii. Measures were taken to set up the programme of the sitting day proceedings including 12 announcements by His Excellency the President, 67 announcements by the speaker, 82 Bills including 35 Government Bills, Supreme Court rulings on the Bills and presentation of documents of the Ministers and so forth.

5.5 Contribution from other sections of the Institution in brief :

1) Serjeant-at-Arms Department:

- (i) 38 Special lectures were given with the support of televisions on the direction of the Hon. Speaker and Secretary General of Parliament for school children, student parliament groups, Youth Parliament groups and adult organizations visiting Parliament and for relevant groups on the request of the Hon. - * Gave clearance for the issue of Compact Disks of House Proceedings.

3) Office of the Parliamentary Interpreters :

* Simultaneous Interpretations of Proceedings of 87 Sittings of Parliament held in 2013 and speeches made by the Hon. Members of Parliament at various Committee Meetings, into Sinhala/Tamil/ English languages were provided.

* The Questions for Oral Answers (which appear in the Order paper of the Parliament) were translated and the number of questions translated by each stream in the interpretation office is as follows;

Sinhala / English Stream: 1302, Sinhala / Tamil Stream: 1110 Tamil / English Stream: 270

In addition to that, other documents such as Adjournment Motions, Private Members' Motions, Parliamentary Business Committee Reports, Audit Paragraphs, COPE Reports, Select Committee Reports etc. were translated.

- * 395 summaries of Petitions (in Sinhala) sent by the Committee on Public Petitions were translated into Tamil Language. Paper advertisements, notices, letters, adjournment motions, reports, private members motions, etc. were translated into Sinhala, Tamil and English.
- * Documents such as Annual Performance Report of Parliament, Report of the Public Petitions Committee and Judgment of Land Partition (Amendment), Documents received from the Hon. Speaker's office, Report of the Select Committee on natural disasters were translated into Tamil, Sinhala and English..

4) Library of the Parliament :

During the year under review, the Library of Parliament has responded to a variety of demands for information of the Parliamentarians including the Hon. Prime Minister, the Hon. Speaker, Hon. Ministers and the Hon. Leader of the Opposition. Activities performed are as follows.

- * Library has lent books and other documents about 663 nos. to Hon. Members of Parliament while catering to improvised information for reference queries on some issues of national importance which called for overall involvement of the staff to go through many number of sources of information including statistics, handbooks, encyclopedias, dictionaries of notable quotations etc.
- * During the year elapsed, Library has actively involved in providing from Sri Lankan Dailies approximately news items 1150 nos. feature articles 350 nos. in support of various topical issues of national interest which were photocopied and scanned for easy reference of Hon. Members.
- * The following library resources have been acquired in Sinhala, Tamil and English to the main collection for the reference and use of the Members of Parliament.

* Research Division of the Library has completed following tasks during the year under review:

179 nos. of MPs requests, 07 nos. of Secretariat Works, 18 nos. of Background notes, 17 nos. of Speeches, 01 Nos. of Technical Reports, 03 nos. of Research Papers and 04 nos. of Special Assignments.

- * In addition, the Research Division has published the publication 'Parliamentary Research Journal Vol. 1 Number, 03, 2013.'
- * Other than that, Library has responded to nearly 250 information needs of Staff of Parliament including the Secretary General, Ministries, Government Departments etc. and general public.

5) Establishments / Members' Services Offices /Internal Audit Office:

- i. During the year 2013, 18 nos. of officers of the staff of the Parliament attended various Foreign Trainings / Study Tours / Conferences and some of them were offered scholarships on financial sponsorship provided by various foreign institutions.
- ii. Training opportunities were provided to 39 members in various posts of the Parliamentary Staff locally, through the Sri Lanka Institute of Development Administration (SLIDA), Skills Development Fund Ltd (SDFL), etc. and an Out-Bound Training Programme for 100 Officers at MAS Fabric Park.
- iii. Actions were taken to conduct 02 Nos. of Public lectures, Workshops, and Awareness Programmes for the benefit of the Staff members during the year 2013.
- iv. Members' Services Office ensured that the Members of Parliament are provided with the facilities and services approved for fulfilling of the affairs of their office as parliamentarians by the sections concerned in Parliament and other external sections, properly and in time.
- v. Activities in Audit and Management Committee, Inquiries, Pre-Auditing, Checking no claims in respect of pension files and certification were attended during the period under review by the Internal Audit Office of the Parliament.
- vi. In addition, actions were taken to implement the decisions of the Audit and Management Committee.


6) Foreign Relations and Protocol Office :
